



Merriwa Pre-School and Activity Centre

SETTLING SUCCESS

Starting or resuming Pre-school can be an emotional experience for both you and your child. Children especially can often experience some difficulty settling into a new environment, particularly if they find it hard to separate from family or familiar caregivers. This is part of an information sheet from startingblocks.com.au that offers some suggestions that can help you support your child during the settling in period. You will of course need to be patient because they may cry, be grumpy or throw tantrums for an initial time as they get used to the new environment.

PREPARE THEM FOR SEPARATION

- Talk about Pre-school with your child and let them know that you are happy and confident that they will have a good time and will be cared for
- If possible, start with shorter or fewer days then gradually increase their time spent at school. Once they develop a settling routine, they should be more comfortable
- Don't let your emotions or anxieties affect your child. Try and hold back your tears when you drop them off
- Say 'goodbye' confidently and reassure them when you leave that you (or someone else) will be back later to collect them
- Give your child sufficient time to say their goodbyes in the morning. Reach the Pre-School centre early so you have time to prepare your child for a good day.

COMFORT THEM

- Ask your child if they would like to take their favourite toy or colour book to the centre
- Find a preferred staff member that your child can be left with when you drop them off for the day
- Spend some time settling your child into a favourite activity before you leave
- Inform the service about what comforts your child and discuss how you manage activities or times of the day they find unsettling. For

- example, does your child have a toy or blanket that helps them to settle?
- Show empathy in the morning when you see your child upset on your way to Pre-School, talk to them. It is advised not to share your own worries but tell your child that they'll be okay. Ask them to share their feelings with you. Listen to them and tell them what they are feeling is normal and it's a big step for them as they are growing up
- Where possible, organise play dates outside of Pre-School. This will help your child be more comfortable with the other children at the centre.

ENCOURAGE THEM

- Every time you go to pick up your child from their centre, tell them they did great that day
- Encourage your little one to pack their bag with essentials they will need for the day. If they are too young to pack their bag themselves, ask them if they would like to take a toy/book with them. Pack a comforter

 a toy or blanket that is something familiar from home for them
- Take the time to have a nice conversation at the breakfast table. Tell them the time at what you'll be picking them up
- Talking with children and encouraging them to voice any concerns or anxieties they may have is a helpful strategy
- For your peace of mind, it can be helpful to call the service later to see how your child settled. Children who become very upset when they are left often settle very quickly and happily once the actual separation is over. The service should enable you to contact them throughout the day
- You may also want to speak to the educators at Pre-School about how you can better support your child's transition.

How you can reconnect with your child after a day in Pre-school:

It's not only a new experience for your child, it's also important for you to know how they feel about going to their early childhood education and care service. This will help you connect and build a strong relationship with your child. After you pick them up from their centre, give them your undivided attention. They might be grumpy because they haven't seen you the whole day, so shower them with all the love you can. Create

a meaningful conversation with them after their day at a service.

Here are some suggestions:

- Ask them about their favourite activities of the day
- Talk to them about the friends they have made. Ask them to name a few children who you know your child is friendly with or spends time playing with
- Talk to them about their favourite educator at Pre-School and what they like about them
- Ask them if their educator read them any story, which one was it, and what they liked about it
- Mention some items that your child would see or play with at the service, as this helps them recall situations. For instance, ask them what they and their friends made with the blocks
- Ask them if they learned anything new
- Use images or notes from the educators at the centre for

conversation. For example, "Look at this lovely photo of you at the sandpit. What did sand feel like in your toes?"

REFLECTION EPIPHANY 5 MATTHEW 5:13-20

The fifth of the Ten Commandments commands us to honour our parents. The Bible teaches that a child can do this by accepting their parental authority and paying attention to their wisdom. That way the child begins to espouse their family's values. When it works well, this process can ensure that godly values are passed from generation to generation and that children enter adulthood well equipped to meet life's challenges.

God refers to his chosen people as 'his Son' and they considered him their Heavenly Father. Therefore the same process through which God intended people to assimilate the wisdom of this process, he also envisaged as the mechanism for mankind to assimilate divine wisdom. Hence, some Rabbis would later decide that honouring your parent was the greatest commandment, while Jesus himself spoke of the need for adults to become like children in their attitude to this divine parent.

It is through its relationship to God's words had nis wisdom that this passage is tied into the fifth commandment. The priesthood were supposed to act as an embodiment of their Heavenly Father's values. Their sanctuary in Jerusalem was supposed to be a shining beacon of God's wisdom, continuously available to all who sought it. The nation's leaders, priests and teachers were therefore charged (through a 'covenant of salt') to ensuring that Israel understood their Father's decrees (the Law). The bracketing of these verses between two highly structured sections. The Beatitudes and the Antitheses, see us designed to highlight this passage. Seven blessings on those who have obeyed their Heavenly Father, balanced by six corrections for those whose behavior has failed to take account of their Heavenly Father's nature. Between which lies the Law. The six/seven division itself is significant, for six and seven were

symbolic numbers associated with perfection and imperfection accordingly. (From "Text For the Week")



TWINE AND LEATHER FREE CROCHET BASKET PATTERN

- Approx 2,000' total yarn (8ply)
- 3 Zip-Loc bags (to keep the twine from tangling while you work)

DISPOSAL OF GREEN WASTE

Upper Hunter Shire Council is reminding residents that green waste is accepted for a fee at waste management facilities and should not be illegally dumped.

Residents are also asked to be on the look out and report all dumped rubbish.

The cost to Upper Hunter Shire ratepayers for the clean-up of illegal dumping runs into tens of thousands of dollars a year (without including the cost of investigations, staff wages and vehicle costs).

ratepayers, the Upper Hunter's clean, green image and creates additional threats from bushfire.

Fines for littering from vehicles can also be issued based on reports from the public. These fines range from \$250.00 for an individual, \$500 for a corporation, to \$900.00 for aggravated littering such as lit cigarette butts during extreme conditions.

Illegal dumping has not been a major problem in the Upper Hunter Shire previously, however in 2019 there were 32 reported illegal dumping incidents.

Upper Hunter Shire Council's Director Environmental and Community Services Mat Pringle is urging anyone who has information about dumping to report incidents online at https://ridonline.epa.nsw.gov.au or phone Council on 6540 1100.

"In most instances where Council can locate the offender, cost recovery can generally occur. However, the time and resources in conducting the investigation carry costs that vary with the scale and severity of the incident," Mr Pringle said.

Reports need to be made within 14 days of the incident and must include a range of information including car registration and description, date, time, location and the type of littered item where possible.



MERRIWA UNDEFEATED SEASON COMES
TO AN END

After making it to round 16 of the season undefeated, Merriwa finally

succumbed to a loss against a strong Belmore Bulls team. More on that game later.

Firstly, two Saturdays ago, we hosted the Bushrangers. Merriwa won the toss and batted first on what looked to be another high quality wicket, albeit a little wet from a storm Friday night. The openers didn't last long, with Pete Ashford and Brad falling cheaply, at which time the decision to bat by the stand in skipper John Maben looked iffy. It certainly wasn't easy early on but Greg Sheehan and Doug Munro managed to work their way into a rhythm that would set the home side up for a respectable total given the conditions. Greg posted 61 and Doug 45 before a middle order collapse put pressure again on the ever dependable Ben Nebeaur and Neville Blackadder. Neville ended up with 36, including four sixes, one of which should have flown further according to Nev who wasn't satisfied with only just clearing the boundary; Ben made a handy 18. Tim Smith bowled with good speed and proved extremely dangerous, picking up five wickets for 27 runs in

a standout performance for the Bushrangers. Merriwa posted 8/201 after the 40 overs.

In the second innings, Merriwa's accurate opening bowlers and energetic field made it all but impossible to score, with Brad picking up the first wicket in the sixth over to make it one for five. The first and second change bowlers did the bulk of the work in terms of wickets, Greg taking 3/18, and Doug 3/17, with Neville also taking two wickets for 13. The talented all rounder Jake Teague top scored for the visitors with 24 but it wasn't nearly enough as the Bushrangers fell for 74.

Last Saturday, Merriwa travelled to the Bill Rose Sports Ground to attempt to keep their undefeated season hopes. Jon Osmond won the toss and elected to bat first in searing heat. A first ball boundary to Jon would provide false confidence to the batsmen waiting on the sideline. Top scorer was Neville batting 8th with 15, Chris Knight and Ben Crackett (the current top wicket taker in the competition) shared the bulk of the wickets with three each for 29 and 17 respectively. Merriwa reached 95, but it could have been worse. A quiet confidence could be felt facing the defence of the low total, however it certainly wouldn't be easy to escape a loss.

Charlie Stokes started with three maidens in a row and a nick of the stumps so light that the bail dislodged from the groove but remained sitting on the crest of the stump; Brad trapped Ben Crackett LBW for 12 in the tenth over. It remained difficult to score but the Bulls seemed comfortable cruising at a snail's pace, precisely what was needed to run the total down. Greg had Chris Knight out caught in the 17th over to make it 2/27.

The Bulls kept at it, chipping away doggedly; the score reached 48 before the next wicket of Mick Davidson, bowled by Charlie in the 24th over. Another two quick wickets gave the away side hope but it was short lived. Will King had a defining innings for the Bulls, coming in the tenth over, and remained stubbornly put until Merriwa were run down with only three overs to spare, scoring 35 not out. Charlie took three for ten from eight, and Brad, Doug, Neville and Greg took a wicket apiece.

Merriwa remains on the top of the table; Belltrees, close behind, also had a loss on the weekend and therefore failed to move to top place. Next week is a home game, facing rivals Murrurundi starting at 1.00pm.
