A Walk Down Memory Lane

WITH JAMES CONSTABLE

THE CATHOLIC CHURCH IN BETTINGTON STREET

Initially the Catholic Church owned both sides of Bettington street. They sold the northern side of the street which was acquired by the Wicks family. The southern side of Bettington was to become the site for a cemetery (pool area) a church and a school.

The first Catholic Church in Merriwa was situated iust behind where the fountain is in Pioneer Park. St Matthias Church was built about 1858 and was officially opened by Archbishop John Bede Polding on February 20, 1860. While rotary hoeing for a garden bed between the fountain and the pool fence, I ploughed up several rectangular sandstone blocks which were the foundations of the old church. The Catholic Church had a presence in Gammon Plains, later to be named Merriwa as early as July 1839 when Father John Lynch baptised Thomas Dooling at Cassilis.



Book week was conducted very differently this year as a result of COVID but students and staff embraced the theme at school maintaining a focus on Reading.






GRANDPARENTS DAY





WELCOME TERM 4 IN YEAR 3 AND 4!

We have had a busy but very productive first couple of weeks of term within Stage 2.

Students at St Joseph's have been working hard to practise and perfect their dance and acting skills and memory. Last Tuesday, we were fortunate enough to have Montana Doyle an ASPIRE dance teacher return for her second visit, to finalise our dances for our school play. Over the last few weeks, students' drama skills have noticeably improved. They have been memorising their lines and taking on their character's role with confidence. We look forward to recording our school production on Wednesday November 11 at the School of Arts.






This term within English sees us looking at the topic of Characterisation. Students will be exposed to a variety of quality literature to engage in the study and exploration of characterisation. This will involve students identifying and describing the physical qualities of characters as well as the personality traits of characters within a text. Currently, Stage 2 have been identifying and analysing rich language through looking at bump it up walls as they develop an understanding of how adjectives, verbs, similes, personification and direct and indirect speech can enhance character development in a text.

Our Science unit 'Magic Marble' provides students with the opportunity to explore and classify forces as contact/non-contact and push/pull. Students have thoroughly enjoyed participating in lots of hands-on activities to identify forces that act at a distance and those that act in direct contact. They will then explore the ways forces are used to affect speed and direction of a moving object and apply this knowledge to creating a marble maze. Already this term, students have been highly engaged in science lessons and activities.









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In Maths, students will look at a variety of different areas within the strands of number and algebra, measurement and geometry and chance and data. We have also started brushing up on and practising our skills for our in-class Maths Bee. This will be held in class during Week 4.

In Religion, students have been deepening their knowledge and understanding of liturgy and liturgical celebrations. This topic also allows students to gain an understanding of how liturgy inspires believers to prayer and a deeper understanding of the mystery of God. In the second half of the term Stage 2 will learn more about Advent and Christmas. Students will explore and deepen their knowledge of key people and events described in the Infancy

Narratives of Matthew and Luke and ponder the mystery of this wondrous birth and the plight of the Holy Family, as they engage with these great stories of the Christian tradition.

In Geography, students have been investigating the location and geographical characteristics of Australia's neighbouring countries, with the Philippines being of particular interest. In the coming weeks, students will create an information text in a medium of choice explaining cultural traditions of their chosen holiday country. They will identify and discuss similarities and differences between their country and Australia using various forms.

In Health, our focus is 'We're all different' where we will explore and recognise how empathy and respect promotes inclusion by exploring cultural diversity including Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples. Students will also investigate the influence of peers, family and their community when forming their own ideas on significant issues such as appreciating and celebrating difference.

In Visual Art, we are exploring the form of print making through making potato leave stamps. Students have enjoyed analysing the structure of various leaves to inspire their stamp design. Students will create a Summer vs Winter tree leaf artwork using their print making skills.









Although this year has been an unexpected and extraordinary year, I am so proud of the way Stage 2 has been able to bounce back and make exciting growth within their learning. I have been fortunate enough to have a class who has been able to teach me just as much as I have taught them this year, especially being in my first year out as a teacher. I look forward to enjoying the time together and the exciting learning and opportunities we have ahead of us for the remainder of Term 4.





CURIOUS CREATURES, WILD MINDS



Students enjoyed the fun of dressing up last week as part of the CBCA Book Week. Each year, schools and public libraries across Australia

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spend a week celebrating books, and Australian authors and illustrators. Teachers and librarians conduct activities relating to a theme to highlight the importance of reading.

After thinking carefully about their favourite characters, students wrote a description of their choice. Olivia, in Year 4, wrote: My character is the evil Grand High Witch out of the classic Roald Dahl story, The Witches. She hates every single child in the entire world and thinks they are all disgusting and revolting! The witch has magical powers which make people disappear and you will never see them again.







HAVE YOU BEEN CHATTING ABOUT YOUR CHILD'S ENGINE?



To continue with the information provided in last week's newsletter, the school held the second session of the Alert Program with fabulous OT Kirsty.

In this session, students:

- Revised the 'Just Right' song.
- Spoke about colours related to engine zones
 blue is low engine, green is calm, yellow is excited and red is when your engine is running high

This may all sound a bit funny but it makes great sense and the students and staff are really responding very well to it. The better a person can regulate themselves (their engines) the better they can learn, play and behave.

Students completed an activity where they moved through a tight caterpillar tunnel made from stretchy material. When the crawled through to the end, they were given a picture of a person to match to the colour of that person's engine.

Students learnt the 'Flea Market' song which involves students listening and rubbing the parts of their body where the song tells you to do it. Touch is a great way to help calm and change

engines. If students are feeling low, it can bring them to the calm engine where their bodies work best.

Students then learnt how moving and heavy work can help their engines. Heavy work can include:

- Using the caterpillar tunnel
- Chair push ups
- Tug of war
- Wall push
- Crash and bump- crash mats, jumping
- Up and down-trampoline, jumping, hopping
- Front and back-swinging on a rocking chair
- Upside down- monkey bars, lounge, yoga
- Circles-slide, sit and spin

Ask your child to show you the strategies they were taught in class using their hands.

The Alert Program will continue this Friday.

SEE YOU AT THE POOLS

Swimming Pools in Merriwa, Murrurundi and Scone are open from Saturday 3 October 2020.

There are changes at the pools due to NSW Government Public Health Orders (PHO) around COVID-19 restrictions including the numbers of people allowed at the pools at the same time. Rules will change if the PHOs change.

Scone and Merriwa are each limited to 72 visitors at a time, and Murrurundi 36 visitors. Group bookings are limited to 20 people. Social distancing means a 1.5 metre separation and one person per 4m2 of pool space.

Please shower and put your bathers on at home and come dressed to swim, as change rooms should not be used.

Parents or designated carers (16 years of over) must supervise children up to 12 years of age.

The pools are funded by Upper Hunter Shire Council and managed by Lifeguarding Services Australia.

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REFLECTION PENTECOST 21 - Matthew 22:34-40

If you recall last week I asked the question "What belongs to God?" This week Jesus gives the answer; "your whole heart, your whole soul, your whole mind. That's all!"

I find the above paragraph quite overwhelming. God wants so much and there seems no room for compromise – your whole heart, whole soul, whole mind. I want to negotiate this a little. 'How about you have 90% and leave me with 10% - that sounds reasonable and very generous really. But God's reply is unequivocal – 'whole 100%'. When I hear these words I am reminded of weddings I have attended and the marvel I feel as two people give themselves entirely to each other without reserve – sickness and health, richer or poorer, till death. This is 100%, whole heart, whole soul and whole mind. Love makes such total surrender both desirable and possible.

Perhaps this is what this Gospel is expressing. God desires us with such 100% love and wants us to respond to this love wholeheartedly. Again I consider marriage offers the best image of such mutual self giving and receiving. Part of the problem with God's love is that it seems so unbelievable. How could God possibly love me 100% when my life is so messy; parts of it I don't like, so how can I expect God to loke it. Surely God likes the good bits, the successful bits, the public bits. But then I come back to the marriage commitment and the Gospel words. Love means the whole of me; richer or poorer, good times and bad; whole heart, whole soul, whole mind. 


