# **Principal's Report**

The welcome rains have brought delight to many over the past week, after what has been to many a dismal dry summer. It has thrown a spanner in the works for our swimming carnival, however that is a minor inconvenience in the grand scheme of things.

#### SCHOOL IMPROVEMENTS

Parents would have noticed contractors on site over the past couple of weeks attending to ongoing school maintenance. A new shade sail and timber framework has been installed on the infants play equipment, the upgrade of the primary canteen is nearing completion, painting of the primary COLA and measures to discourage pidgeon's from nesting, painting of the secondary Great Hall, and new carpet and lino in classrooms. Disruption to classes has been minimal with some changes to routines and rooming to accommodate the work being carried out. Currently a secondary demountable is out of action due to refurbishment, and the secondary COLA is undergoing major groundworks to address seating and drainage issues. In addition by the end of term new fencing will be installed on the secondary campus.

A significant project under consideration for future improvements is the enclosing of the secondary COLA which would provide wet weather sporting facilities and whole school assemblies to be held.

Year 7 students will head off to camp on February 24, parents are reminded that final payments are due for this excursion. This is a fantastic opportunity for our students to get together supported by our senior Year 11 students. #### NURSERY RHYMES


Students in the Busby Room are learning about nursery rhymes. These are great for the brain's development. Through hearing the rhymes in these stories, children learn more about language.

#### THE KINDERGARTEN JOURNEY BEGINS

Our Kindergarten students have embraced their introduction to school life with joyful enthusiasm. Relationships are the foundation of any successful partnership and we are happy to acknowledge that students, parents and staff are continuing to work together to ensure each student reaches their potential. Our extensive Transition Program has certainly created a familiar environment for our students, along with our annual Belonging Day, held in January.

Students are learning all about the concept of 'story' in English. There is a kind of magic when we have the pleasure of reading a story to a group of attentive children... as teachers and parents we have the joint responsibility of developing the literacy skills of the children in our care. To develop comprehension skills, we have been looking at illustrations, vocabulary, sequencing and characters. We have been practicing nursery rhymes through song and dance. Students are already aware of the daily requirements of writing the date and a heading, that we read and write for a purpose. Importantly, students are encouraged to enhance their communication skills through a variety of speaking and listening activities.

Mathematics has been lots of fun too, as the students explore their number knowledge through counting, using charts, dice and a variety of materials. The students are enjoying the activities and have shown wonderful interest.

The children have been discussing "Jesus as a friend" in Religious Studies. Jesus was a true and loyal friend to everyone, teaching us to treat everyone kindly, with equality and respect. We've talked about ways we can all be a real friend to others, by listening and reaching out to those in need.

Science has seen us experimenting with toys, observing and recording how they move. Using positional language, the students will be designing an algorithm- a set of instructions on a grid. It is certain our students are IT specialists of the future... how exciting to be discussing physics and grid references with Kindergarten students.

During History, we are focusing on students' backgrounds, past experiences and memories,

and on important people in their lives. They will be provided with opportunities to compare themselves with others in their class and with people from different places and times. We will explore aspects of the Dreamtime and other special cultural concepts. Exploring our own and others' heritage gives us a strong sense of identity and belonging. We are looking forward to Harmony Day on March 23, when we will welcome some local guest speakers to our school.







#### **OPENING SCHOOL MASS**

On Monday morning, students, staff and the wider school community gathered for our Opening School Mass. It was wonderful to see so many families in attendance, supporting the children.

Our Year 6 students were commissioned with their leadership badges and pledged to continue the fine traditions of leadership within the school.



#### **REFLECTION EPIPHANY 6 MATTHEW 5:21-27**

This week's reading follows the Beautitudes to form the Sermon on the Mount. It contains no parables or miracles, only straightforward teaching. We find here strong ties to the Mosaic Law. The opening verses of Chapter 5 tell us that this Jesus has left the crowds and is teaching his disciples. Jesus is the teacher bridging familiar lessons from Jewish teaching to his own ministry as he instructs his disciples in the demands of a Jesus-following life.

We often read Jesus' statements in this discourse – "You have heard that it was said..." followed by "but I say to you..." as contrasting or even replacing prior Jewish teachings with his own. We must take care in such contrasts for Jesus neither erases nor discounts the teachings of the Law. He uses the traditional teachings on murder, adultery and prayer as essential grounds for building his case for righteousness. Using familiar teachings Jesus intensifies and radicalizes them for his listeners, extending these teachings into almost every area of life.

In this way Jesus does not abolish but fulfills the Law. No longer do the teachings on murder and adultery apply strictly to acts of murder and adultery. Instead they become doorways into the examination of many internal dynamics as well as external behaviours of one's life: anger, derision, slander, false generosity, litigiousness, arrogance, lust, temptation, alienation, divorce and religious speech.

Perhaps one of the most radical aspects of Jesus extension of the Law is its internalization of it, so that not only behaviours but attitudes and emotions fall within its scope. Of course this is not new to Jewish thinking. Throughout Hebrew Scriptures, the Law is to be taken to the heart and not outwardly observed. It is one thing to behave rightly. It is another thing entirely for one's heart to be orientated towards love. Just as it is easier to make a sacrifice at the temple than it is to do

justice, so it is easier to keep the commandment against murder than it is to avoid anger on one's heart. From "Text For the Week")




