The move to organise horse sports, confined to events for young people was the brainchild of Sgt C D Williams. He said"We have our rodeos and other sports with horse events for adults, but very little provision is made for the juveniles". Sat Williams called a public meeting, held in Merriwa at the School of Arts on 7th April 1945 with the aim to arrange a pony and athletic sports afternoon for children.



The first sports and athletic carnival was held on Saturday 19th May 1945 at the Merriwa Showground and was a success from the word go. Over 50 horses were entered in the various events and the carnival commenced with a parade from the Post Office to the Showground.

It is also drawing closer to the time that we say farewell to the wonderfully bright and talented Mrs Hagley, who is soon starting an exciting chapter in her life as an Assistant Principal in Biloela. We wish her and the Hagley's all the best in their future endeavours.

Kinderhave been very busy this term! The children performed beautifully in the school play, "The Year of Corona". They were fully committed to their part in the play and their dedication was evident in the final recording. Mrs Hagley and Miss Brazier couldn't be prouder!

In class, we have enjoyed choosing and listening to quality children's literature. Last week, each student chose a book from the library to bring to the classroom and every morning, Miss Brazier pulled a name out and that child's book was read to the class.

Kinder have also been applying themselves diligently to their writing and the effort has been clear in their work. REFLECTION - ADVENT 2 - Mark 1:108

Here we have the first written proclamation of the Gospel – the Good News of Jesus the Christ, the Son of God. Mark wastes no time in his announcement with a long introduction but instead immediately introduces John. Since the discovery of the Dead See Scrolls scholars now know that at this time there were some in Israel who had a strong sense that God's Kingdom was about to break into history. The community of Qumran by the Dead Sea lived with this expectation and they also practiced rituals of cleansing. While there is no evidence that John was part of this group, his message and the manner are similar. God's reign is coming. Prepare for it by seeking forgiveness.

Baptism, immersion in water, was a common Jewish practice as a way of purifying oneself before participating in major religious festivals. John applies this ritual to a desire for repentance as preparation for the coming Kingdom. John was remembered as a great and holy man of God. He too attracted disciples and even Jesus came to him seeking his baptism. These historical facts must have puzzled the early Christians, particularly if some of John's disciples were now part of the Jesus group. How were they to speak about John, recognizing his greatness while acknowledging that Jesus was even greater? In trying to understand John's role in Jesus' story, Mark looks back to the Jewish Scriptures and uses the prophets Malachi and Isaiah to clarify John's role is one of preparation for another greater figure who is on the way. A Walk Down Memory Lane

Sgt Williams received many a congratulation throughout the day on his suggestion which prompted the day. There were three carnivals organised by Sgt Williams prior to the official formation of the Merriwa Pony Club. Those three days were just known as children's sports under the auspices of the Merriwa Bushman's Carnival Association.

On Saturday, 13th July, 1946, a meeting was held in the Merriwa School of Arts, called by Sgt C D Williams for the purpose of forming an organisation to carry on the childrens horse sports carnivals in the future. The reason for calling this meeting, Sgt Williams had received a promotion and was soon to move to Orange. He was keen that the carnivals should be continued and a committee formed to run them. Mr John See said that Sgt Williams had been more or less responsible for running the carnivals in the past and there was a fear, now that he was moving away, that they might lapse. They would like to see a committee formed to carry on the children's light horse and pony sports, draw up a constitution and decide on a name for the organisation. Those present at the meeting were Sgt C D Williams (who presided) Messrs J B See, G D Scales, J R Telfer, T B MacFarlane, L Tink, A A Henderson, A Brown, A S Rodgers, S J Hunt, E H Ell and W R Goddard. A provisional committee was appointed to draw up a constitution for the formation of an organisation on the 18th July 1946. Mr J B See(president) prepared a constitution to act as a basis of discussion and it was modelled on, to some extent, a constitution as developed for similar types of bodies under the RAS.

The next meeting was held on 3rd August 1946, the draft constitution prepared by the provisional

committee, was, with a few minor amendments, adopted and provides that the organisation shall be known as the Merriwa Pony Club.

The election of office bearers are as follows President Mr J B See, Senior Vice President Mr G D Scales, Junior Vice President Master Doug Rodgers, Hon. Secretary Mr L A Whitelaw, Hon. Treasurer Mr E Hunt, Auditor Mr A J Spratt.

A committee of ten (seven senior members and three junior members.) They were A S Rodgers,

L Tink, G W Harcourt, R Gleeson, A Brown, S Hunt and J R Telfer.

Junior members were Peter Gleeson, Grant Harcourt and Tim Scales.


