

Principal's Report

NATIONAL DAY OF ACTION AGAINST BULLYING AND VIOLENCE (NDA)

This year marks the 10th anniversary of the National Day of Action against Bullying and Violence (NDA).

On Friday March 20, Take Action Together and share the Bullying. No Way! message with school communities across the nation.

Merriwa Central School will wear pink shirts to stand against Bullying and support Upper Hunter Youth Council. We will participate in school activities to review the school process and expectations of students with regards to bullying.

At Merriwa Central School we aim to create a safe and supportive school community for everyone.

Parents are an important part of our work to prevent bullying and to respond effectively if it happens. Stopping bullying involves everyone.

Parents know their children best and know the best way to tailor communication to their needs. Adapt these tips to what works for you and your child.

If your child talks to you about bullying:

- 1. Listen calmly and get the full story. Your calm response is important to allow your child to tell you all about the situation. After they've told you their story, ask questions to get more details if you need: who, what, where, when. Although you may feel some strong emotions about your child's experience, try to keep calm to avoid more distress to your child
- 2. Reassure your child they are not to blame. Many children blame themselves and this may make them feel even worse. You could say things like, 'That sounds really hard to deal with. No one should have to put up with that.' or 'I'm so glad you told me. You should be able to feel safe at school; that's not fair at all'
- 3. Ask your child what they want to do and what they want you to do. A critical part of your response is to avoid jumping in to solve the problem. While it is natural to want to

protect your child, helping them to find their own solution is a better option. It helps them feel they have some power in the situation

- 4. Visit www.bullyingnoway.gov.au to find some strategies. The website has tips and ideas for different bullying situations. One idea is to practise strategies at home to help your child feel more confident
- 5. Contact the school. Your child may be reluctant for you to do this, so discuss the idea and reassure them that the school would want to know and is able to help. Make an appointment to meet with your child's teacher and, if you need to, ask to talk with the principal. Contact the school immediately if you have a concern about your child's safety
- 6. Check in regularly with your child. Keep the conversation going. It can take time to resolve issues, so check in regularly with your child about their experiences and their feelings. Your ongoing support is important.

LYN SHARRATT – CLARITY "PUTTING FACES ON THE DATA"

Last Thursday and Friday, Mrs Peebles and I attended the Leading Learning Collaborative, which was hosted by Lyn Sharratt, world renowned educational researcher from Canada.

The main focus of the day was looking into the 14 Parameters of school improvement. What both Mrs Peebles and myself enjoyed the most about the two days was Lyn's relentless and unwavering message that all students can learn to high levels and all teachers must be teachers of intervention, that is, teachers who can see the

need in their students and work towards finding ways to help their students.

Over the course of the year and beyond, staff and students will be looking at various facets of learning improvement, such as Learning Intentions and Success Criteria. We have begun this process in Mathematics and this year the focus will be on English.

Learning Intentions and Success Criteria work effectively to enable students to name their learning, understand how it works in the real world and be able to track their own progress as they work through their learning. Teachers use these concepts to form accurate and meaningful outcomes for students, to have learning conversations with students and keep themselves on track in ensuring what is taught is of the highest quality possible.

FIVE QUESTIONS TO ASK YOUR CHILDREN

Instead of the regular conversations we can have with our children at the end of the school day, which usually start with, "What did you do today?" and ending with "nothing", here are five questions you might like to engage your children with: (From Clarity – Lyn Sharratt P65)

- 1. What did you learn today?
- 2. How did you do?
- 3. What did you do if you didn't understand?
- 4. How can you improve on your learning?
- 5. What are you most proud of?

GOAL SETTING MEETINGS

As part of our commitment to all families and students in bringing out the best in our learners, we recently held our goal setting meetings. All reports were of very successful and fruitful meetings with our families with attainable and meaningful goals set for the year.

COGAT TESTING

As part of the Catholic Schools Office Gifted Education Policy and Procedures, we have begun the administration of the Cognitive Abilities Test (CoGAT), last week with Stage One students.

The CoGAT is a multiple-choice Kinder-Year 12

assessment that measures reasoning skills with different types of verbal, quantitative, and nonverbal questions.

Students only have to work with this assessment once in their schooling with us. We hope that the results gathered will give the school greater information in how to best support our students.

caterpillar with foods that begin with 'c'. I hope that he loved his cauliflower!




ASK YOUR CHILD WHO WASEDWARD HARGRAVES?

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






HEALTH AND SAFETY

As the cooler weather begins to approach we turn our attention to the health and safety of our student body.

Staying Healthy in Children's Services Edition 5 is our reference when advising families and providing information about illnesses, It includes exclusion periods and guidelines for the service and families to follow to help keep everyone safe. It is an easy download so families can have access to the document at home. www.nhmrc. gov.au

If a confirmed infectious disease breaks out at the Pre-School our obligation is to exclude the child for the prescribed period and to inform families through our prescribed information form which is located just inside the front double doors. If this disease is vaccine preventable and your child's immunisation status is not fully up to date that child will also be excluded for their protection. Only 95% of children are fully vaccinated in NSW which means there is 1 in 20 children unprotected from terrible diseases that can be life long and life threatening. The resurgence of vaccine preventable diseases is alarming and any unvaccinated children will not be enrolled at the Pre-School.

In most cases you will also receive a notification through the Xplor App or through our Facebook page. This type of notification is at times informal and is provided to communicate all useful information to families. If this is a confirmed case I will make that clear during the notification, otherwise it is information passed from one service user to another for your general awareness of what's getting about.


Generally, if your child is unwell, lethargic or has a temperature they should not attend Pre-School. The best way to protect your child this season is the flu shot and it is free for children from six months to under 5 years old. The annual shot from May each year is your best chance to avoid flu infections. For more information go to health.nsw.gov.au/flu or speak with your doctor.

In relation to COVID 19 - if you or your child has been out of the country or had contact with confirmed cases of COVID 19 you will be required to self - isolate with chicken soup and be excluded from education and care services for 14 days. Of course, if there is an unusual respiratory illness or cough, high fevers or sore throats, please call your GP. The best way to avoid contraction of this virus is by washing hands, cover those coughs and sneezes and stay at home If you are unwell.

From time to time we receive sensitive information at the Pre-School. This could be regarding serious illnesses, custody and guardianship information, complaints or concerns. These issues should be communicated to the Director or in her absence the responsible person at the service. If the Responsible person is placed for the day then this is noted with a photo and documentation in the yellow noticeboard at the gateway. This can also be communicated to the room leader who is generally Leah from Monday to Wednesday and Nikki Feeney Thursday and Friday. It is then our job to disseminate this information to relevant staff if it is necessary.

If a complaint concerns the Director then that should be forwarded immediately to the President of the association, her contact details are available on the notice board at the Pre-School.

For all child and family sensitive information please email director.mps@tpg.com.au for account information merriwapreschool@tpg. com.au Pleased be advised that if you are using email to communicate collection details, illnesses or authorisations that emails are not thoroughly monitored everyday and it is best to call the service on 6548 2083 to ensure effective communication on time critical information.

REFLECTION LENT 5 JOHN 11:1-45

One of the concerns faced by the Johannine community living in the late 90s was the issue of Christian death. Jesus had promised life to those who believed in him, but in the time after Jesus' resurrection how is this promise to be understood. The reality is that Christians do die, so what can Jesus' words mean? The Lazarus episode is the Gospel writer's reflection on the promises of Jesus to be a source of eternal life, and the reality of Christian death.

Many Jews did believe in resurrection at the end of time. This is the faith that Martha expressed, that her brother will rise on the last day. What mainline Jewish theology lacked was any sense of what happened between death and the end-of-time resurrection. This was an empty space where the dead had no share in God's life. In the Lazarus episode Jesus shows that there is a life beyond the grave, even as we await resurrection at the end of time. While physical life will cease, the God-life that has been given to us through Jesus will never cease.

Christians today, like John's community, still face the great mystery of death. Our Christian hope is that God keeps faith with us. The power of God manifest in Jesus' Resurrection is a power for life in which we will share. Jesus displayed this power for life in restoring the life of Lazarus and thus revealing that death for the believer is not a dead-end. The God who has called us into life remains faithful to that gift of life.

Jesus says, "I have come that you may have life – to the full" (From "Sundays Under the Southern Cross" by Mary Coloe PBVM)

Michael Johnsen MP, Member for Upper Hunter has announced \$814,517 from the NSW Government's Stronger Country Communities Fund for projects in the Upper Hunter Shire Council.

Cassilis District Development Group Incorporated was awarded \$52,952 for new seating, upgraded shade structures, and landscape design for the War Memorial at Cassilis Memorial Park

The Merriwa CBD Refurbishment to the value of \$143,438, was one of four Council projects to receive funding. Merriwa will receive a footpath upgrade. The existing footpath will be demolished and removed with new concrete pavement constructed to comply with access standards and the Merriwa Progress Association town revitalisation plans. This project will increase safety with improved pedestrian access, and the revitalised section of footpath will be areener with landscaping to provide more shade to the town centre.

The 4 projects Council put forward received the highest level of support from the public and business communities. The projects were the result of extensive community consultation, with the general public submitting their ideas for funding and support for projects.




