Deputy Principal's Report COVID-19 INFORMATION FOR PARENTS/CARERS

Information is rapidly changing in relation to the COVID-19 outbreak, and its impact on the community and schools.

The Premier has urged parents to keep children at home to contain the spread of the virus. The Department supports parents in their choice to keep children at home. Schools will remain open for parents who have limited childcare options.

Our teachers have prepared work for students to complete from home. We understand many families do not have computers, or access to reliable internet. Students will be provided with hard copies of work to take home. In Kinder-Year 6 this will likely be a booklet, in Year 7-10 it may be worksheets, in Year 11-12 it could be work assigned from their text books.

School will not operate as normal for those students who do attend. Teaching staff will supervise students completing the set units of work.

The current circumstances are unprecedented. It is important that we stay calm, and follow advice from Health Officials.

LEARNING

Students have had a lot of fun in Science this week.

In Early Stage One/Stage One, students have been looking at making cars with rubber bands and cardboard! They have learned about the different forces used on the rubber band, such as tension, for the car to move effectively.

In Stage Two, students have combined mathematics and science to create sundials, which worked! They looked at the different angles of the rocks, sizes of the rocks as well as the position to place them in, to ensure that they are as accurate as possible.

In Stage Three, students have worked designing and making their own parachutes. They have used the COWS method. In basic terms, we are speaking like scientists. What can we CHANGE, MEASURE and keep the SAME in our experiment to test whether something works well or not. We even spoke about the various methods scientists use to create vaccines (quite a relevant topic right now!)

REFLECTION PALM SUNDAY Matthew 26:14-27, 66

Today we hear the story that is at the heart of Christian faith. The death of Jesus was no ordinary execution. We believe that this death had a meaning that touches all human life, yours and mine. Matthew writes for a Jewish community who are familiar with daily sacrifices of animals and the pouring out of their blood for the forgiveness of sin. This is the theological meaning that Matthew sees in Jesus' death. During the final meal with his friends Jesus takes wine and says "This is my blood of the covenant which is poured out for many for the forgiveness of sins." This is the meaning of the cross as Matthew understood it from his Jewish background, and is the extraordinary good-news that the disciples proclaimed. In Jesus' death sin has been forgiven. The barrier between God and humanity has been overcome.

It saddens me sometimes to meet people who are weighed down with a sense of guilt and unworthiness. These people have forgotten the message of the cross and Easter. Sin is forgiven. God has forgiven us but can we forgive ourselves? Can we hold in our hands our unworthiness, our failures, our small-minded less-than-generous actions, and surrender these to God in order to be open to receive the blessings of Easter? If we cannot accept the love and forgiveness of God then Jesus' death for us has been in vain. As we listen to the passion, let us hear in it the depth of God's love for us, and not let self-doubt and guilt hold us back from receiving it. In the words of John Paul ! 'The Cross is like a touch of eternal love upon the most painful wounds of our earthly existence' (Rich in Compassion, Encyclical 1980) (From "Sundays Under the Southern Cross" by Mary Coloe PBVM).

UPPER HUNTER EVENTS CANCELLED INCLUDING FESTIVAL OF THE FLEECES

The following events, organised by Upper Hunter Shire Council, have been cancelled or postponed for 2020, as a precautionary measure to help prevent the spread of coronavirus:

- Inaugural Adams-Watts Social Justice Oration to celebrate International Women's Day - March 18
- Murrurundi Uke Muster March 20
- Saleyards Open Day March 24
- Kia-Ora Youth Music Camp and Concert -April 1-3
- Festival of the Fleeces long weekend in June.

More cancellations and postponements are expected.

Chair of the Merriwa Festival of the Fleeces Committee, Cr Ron Campbell said it was a disappointing but unavoidable decision and the committee was focusing on 2021.

"The red socks will stay in the cupboard and the sheep will stay off the street this year, but Festival of the Fleeces will be back bigger and better with the 30th event now in 2021.

"Sponsors and advertisers who have already contributed will of course, be reimbursed," Cr Campbell said.

"Even without the festival there's plenty to see and do around Merriwa and Goulburn River National Park, including rockpools, giant silo art, ancient indigenous art and rock formations. Come on up and experience our wide open spaces and country hospitality."

Council's General Manager Steve McDonald is urging community and sporting organisations, who have booked Council facilities and venues for events between now and the end of June, to contact Council.

"We are asking organisations to review their risk assessment and response plans, and to report these to Council, informing us of their proposed course of action. Council will review these plans and determine if they are consistent with current guidance and Council's position and liaise with organisers to determine the optimal outcome for the community," Mr McDonald said.

Please be assured the safety and wellbeing of our Shire and our staff is of the upmost priority for Council as we navigate through an unprecedented and difficult time locally, nationally and internationally.
