A Walk Down Memory Lane WITH JAMES CONSTABLE



WHY THE NAME BRINDLEY BETTINGTON?

James Brindley was born 1716. married He Henshall Anne (1747 - 1826). gave They birth to two daughters, Anne (1770-1838) and Suzannah (1772-1798). Related early in history to the Bowmans


who were originally Quakers, the family had a strong belief in education and all the young Brindleys were taught at an old Quaker school house. James Brindley was only interested in windmills, pumps and things mechanical and his school work suffered. His parents, realising where James's talents lay, very wisely apprenticed him to Abraham Bennett, a mill and wheelwright.

A millwright in those days, needed a combination of skills, he had to combine engineering with stone masonry, he had to be able to work timber and also know the skills of a blacksmith and be able to use metal. To build a mill, he had to be a bricklayer and know how to construct dams, sluices and have a keen appreciation of the local topography of the land. He had to have knowledge of hydraulics, to measure the flow of water and it's fall, to compute the potential energy of the site. In the case of windmills, there had to be knowledge of aerodynamics so as to have the correct pitch on the sails. The millwrights were the forerunners of our civil and mechanical engineers.

James Brindley was a quick learner and coupled with his retentive memory, his genius began to emerge. As his reputation grew, he designed



and built more and more ambitious projects, an automatic water wheel which survived until 1952. He constructed stone bridges, canals, tunnels, steam engines and pumps to move water and viaducts to move water to carry barges across valleys. From canals, he moved to arterial canals which allowed canals to be built over a series of valleys, often with the aid of tunnels, cuttings, embankments and aqueducts. Simple canals ran alongside rivers and streams and were of simple construction.

The last school day for students is Thursday December 16, with staff finishing with a School


Development Day on Friday December 17. School will resume in 2022 for students Yr 1-12 on Tuesday February 1, and Kindergarten Wednesday February 2.

REFLECTION ADVENT 3 - Luke 3:10-18

When asked the question, 'What must we do?' John gives advice that is appropriate in our time as it was in his. He tells us, 'Whare with those in need, be fair in your dealings with others and don't abuse your power'. Luke's community is thought to have been the city f Antioch, the third largest city in the Roman Empire at that time. His Gospel must deal with the real-life issues that affect his hearers, such as how to live as a Christian in a complex, urban, economically driven and multi-racial world; does this sound familiar? Being a Christian is far more than one hour of worship each week. We live out Christian values in the choices we make at the supermarket and the bank, the petrol we purchase and the brand of clothes we wear. John's answers were no doubt uncomfortable to his listeners who may have been expecting a more 'religious' answer, such as 'Pray longer in the Synagogue', but John plunges to the heart of the Gospel message. You can desire God's reign or you can seek after wealth and power, but you cannot have both. This may sound impossible but John holds out a message of hope: for having spoken to the people about what they must do, John then speaks of what God will do - baptize you with the Holy Spirit. The symbol of fire associated with the Spirit suggests that the Spirit will purify us. God's gift of a purifying Spirit can empower us to choose the values of God's reign over the attractions of wealth.

As Christmas approaches ask the Baptist your own question, 'What must I do?' And listen for an answer.





A Walk Down Memory Lane

Continued from page 2 The Brindley concept of canals linked the four great ports of London, Liverpool, Bristol and Hull which allowed England to become a leader in the Industrial Revolution. Coal could be carried from it's source to mills and ports, goods to markets and Josiah Wedgwood championed Brindley canals as they allowed him to move his pottery to the markets and ports.

John Henshall was a surveyor and an association developed between Brindley and recruited Henshall to help him with the canal surveying and planning. John Henshall had a very attractive daughter Anne. The attraction grew and in 1765, James's proposal was accepted, the marriage was a great success. Anne was highly intelligent and took over most of Brindley's bookwork and correspondence. This freed him to do what he was good at, the planning and building of canals, mills and steam engines.

To give an indication of the magnitude of his work load from 1766 to 1772, Brindley was involved in the following canal projects.


- 1766 Work commences on the Grand Trunk Canal.
- 1767 Surveys for the Bradford canal, Rochdale canal and the Stockton and Darlingtoncanal.
- 1768 Survey for the Leeds and Liverpool canal.
- 1769 Surveys Leeds and Selby and Oxford canal which would link the system to the Thames and thus London.
- 1770 Prepares scheme for the Thames navigation improvements.
- 1771 Chesterfield canal commences.
- 1772 Survey for the Lancaster canal.

Brindleys frantic workload began to tell on his health, he was diagnosed as having diabetes and in those days there was no cure. James Brindley died on the 27 September 1772, aged 56. His lateral thinking, originality of thought, energy and mechanical genius helped inspire the Industrial Revolution in Britain. He was England's first great civil engineer.

Through the marriage of John Bettington (1793-1818) to Suzannah Brindley (1772-1798),

the names of Brindley and Henshall continue through the Bettington dynasty.
