# GREEN HILLS HOTEL

Senior Sergeant Lucas Armstrong was appointed to Cassilis Police Station at the end of 1862. He was a very capable police officer and was well liked in the village of Cassilis. Lucas was born in Ireland in 1837 (preferred to be called Luke), and arrived in Melbourne in 1857. After being transferred to Cassilis for some time, romanced blossomed between Luke, 27 and Mary Braggett 20, daughter of William Braggett and were married on the 6th January 1865.

Luke left the Police force and applied for a hotel licence as innkeeper at Curry Curryal(sic) creek and commenced life as an innkeeper in mid 1867.


In the mid 1870's Luke acquired a flock of sheep and with a pastoral interest, led to Luke's decision to become a full time grazier after 1881. I made the mistake of assuming Cam Armstrong was a descendant but a conversation with Cam I found this is not the case and is not related.

#### Secondary NSW SCHOOL VACCINATION PROGRAM

Each year NSW Health works in partnership with schools to offer the vaccines recommended by the National Health and Medical Research Council (NHMRC) for adolescents as part of the school vaccination program.

In 2021 the following vaccines will be offered:

Parent Information Kits that include an information sheet, consent form and privacy statement will be sent home to parents/ guardians. To consent to the vaccination of their child, parents/guardians are advised to:

- read all the information provided
- complete the consent form, including signing their name next to the vaccine/s they would like their child to receive

- return the completed consent form to their child's school
- ensure that their child eats breakfast on the day of the school vaccination clinic.

To improve vaccination completion, students who return a signed vaccination consent form while in Year 7 and who miss vaccine doses at any clinic, will be opportunistically offered these vaccines at each clinic visit throughout 2021 (Year 7) and 2022 (Year 8).

Students who have a dose of HPV at their GP can complete the course in the school program if a signed consent form has been returned to school.

Parents/guardians who wish to withdraw their consent for any reason may do so by writing to the school Principal or phoning the school. The Procedure for Withdrawal of Consent is available on the NSW Health website at http:// www.health.nsw.gov.au/immunisation/Pages/ withdraw\_consent.aspx

A Record of Vaccination will be provided to each student vaccinated at each clinic as a physical card. Parents/guardians should ensure that this record is kept for future reference and should not assume that their child has been vaccinated if they do not receive this Record of Vaccination.

#### REFLECTION - EPIPHANY 6 – Mark 1:29-39

Like most Jewish men Simon (Peter) was married although his wife is never mentioned. His motherin-law lives in his home. Since Jewish women married young, in their early teens, this woman need not be very old, perhaps in her thirties or forties.

The Gospel makes a contrast between the religious institutions of the synagogue and later the Temple, and the more domestic scene of the house.

Jesus' ministry frequently happens within the house. Jesus breaks through a number of religious taboos in touching a woman and in touching a person who was sick. These actions would immediately make him ritually unclean. But Jesus shows such taboos have no place in the new household that he is forming around him.

Following a very busy evening of healing and exorcisms Jesus leaves Simon's house to pray. Simon goes in search of him. Perhaps he liked the idea of the healer residing in his home. Who knows what enterprise this could lead to. But Jesus is not to be confined to one home, to one village. He has a mission that is bigger than Simon's current perception. Poor Simon! He wants a domesticated Jesus within his grasp, but Jesus refuses to be so limited.

Religious institutions can try to domesticate Jesus; sometimes I can even try to do this, to have a Jesus I can understand and be comfortable with. What about you? Do you still cling to 'good old plastic Jesus' or has Jesus pushed your boundaries? (From "Sundays Under the Southern Cross" by Mary Coloe PBVM)

## **Upper Hunter Shire Council**

#### ROAD CLOSURE - MERRIWA TO WILLOW TREE ROAD

The MR358 Merriwa to Willow Tree road (also known as Coulson's Creek Road) has been closed to all vehicles due to the current risk of landslip in some sections, with signs of movement including cracking observed in both lanes.

The closure has been undertaken to ensure the safety of road users, based on geo-technical advice.

The alternative route for motorists travelling between Merriwa and Willow Tree is via the New England Highway and Scone/Bunnan Road with expected additional travel time being approximately 30 minutes (44 kilometres).

It is not known how long the road will be closed for.

#### BACKGROUND AND PLANNING

Council has apologised that the road construction undertaken in 2019 has not met specifications, requiring the road to be redesigned and reconstructed.

Upper Hunter Shire Council staff have been undertaking daily visual inspection, with more detailed inspections by engineers weekly and geotechnical specialists on site monthly.

Council has invited specialist road design consultants to tender for the design and specifications to rebuild 3km of MR358 to B-double capacity. Council will invite tenders early to mid 2021 for the reconstruction of the road. A two year construction period is anticipated following the award of contract.

The process to reconstruct the road is being managed by a Project Control Group which includes Transport for New South Wales (TfNSW) staff, Public Works Advisory, Infrastructure New South Wales (INSW) and Council staff.

The long anticipated relaunch of the Hunter Branch Sale come to frutition

this year, in a new format. The challenges of COVID-19 and the unpredictability of everchanging restrictions brought about an opportunity to hold the sale in a different manner than before. It was decided that the sale be conducted online, using the Auctions Plus platform. Hunter Branch decided to entrust the agents of RM Property and Livestock to run this event, beginning on Wednesday January 13 and running until midday Saturday January 16, when the timer was turned on. The sale ran for a further 27 minutes before it timed out and the hammer fell.

Taking the Horse Sale to an online platform meant that vendors could offer horses from all parts of Australia. 40 final lots went under the hammer when the sale commenced, with 25 selling online and 2 selling after the sale's end. Over 750 registered bidders connected with the sale, hailing from every state and territory in Australia. In the lead up to the sale and including the days over which the sale was run, the number of views made to the catalogue through Auctions Plus alone surpassed 6,500. Throughout the sale, there were 68 active bidders.

The highest priced horse was Shadygum Sway, a 3-year-old ridden filly, which sold for \$11,500 on account of Jade Kelly (Cundumbul, NSW). She found her new home with Nicole Neale in Portland, NSW. The highest priced ridden gelding was Bobadil Versace, a 14-year-old Acres Destiny son selling for \$11,000 on account of RM Moore (Merriwa, NSW), to Paul Ryan (Mitchell's Flat, NSW). The highest price for a led horse was a gelding, Rosebrook Intrique, a son of Bonlac Jigaloo for \$5,250 on account of Brandon Parkinson (Muswellbrook, NSW) to Saul & Son (Quirindi, NSW). The highest priced colt or stallion was a yearling colt by Con Man, selling for \$8,000 on account of AW & CJ Smith (Tamworth, NSW), to Hurley Grazing in QLD.

The sale grossed \$148,000 with the average being \$5,480.

From careers workshops in Year 11, Chloe has seen the value of working with people and facilitating their


