A Walk Down Memory Lane

WITH JAMES CONSTABLE

WILLIAM LAWSON

In 1813, Gregory Blaxland, William Lawson and William Wentworth crossed the Blue Mountains, opening up a route to Bathurst.

William Lawson was an outstanding early settler in NSW. He was an army officer, explorer, surveyor, magistrate, politition and bank director. He was one of the founders of our wool industry. a land holder and devoted family man. Sarah Leadbeater was a convict on Norfolk Island who caught Lawson's eye. In due course, they married and the Lawson children went on to marry into some of the leading families of the time. There was a stigma attached to marrying a convict with the new rich and self appointed exclusives frowning upon it and deemed the couple 'not socially acceptable', however this did not deter Lawson from a life filled with purpose, achievement and public duty. His strength and endurance earned him the nickname 'Old Ironbark'

Lawson arrived in Sydney on January 11, 1800 as an ensign. He was assigned to Norfolk Island penal colony, and whilst on the Island, Lawson formed a union with the beautiful convict girl, Sarah Leadbeater and during that time, Sarah bore him two sons, John and William.

Little is known of Sarah Leadbeater, she is recorded as being baptised on March 17, 1782, Manchester Cathedral. Her parents were Thomas and Ann (nee Hasmer) Leadbeater. The Hasmer name has an Arabic connatation. Her fatheris recorded as being a Fustian Cutterwhich would indicate he was employed by the woollen mills of Manchester. She was sentenced to seven years servitude at the Lancaster Quarter Sessions on October 16, 1799. She was 18 years of age and described as beautiful and extremely vivacious.

Sarah arrived in Sydney on the Earl of Cornwallis on June 10, 1801. On arrival, Sarah was assigned





to a Mr David Brown, he had three sons who were convicts, one of whom was sent to Norfolk Island. David went to Norfolk Island to be close to his son and as Sarah was assigned to him was taken along as well. William was acquainted with the Browns at Parramatta and it seems that William met Sarah through his association with the Browns. On March 23 1812, william Lawson and Sarah Leadbeater were married by special licence at St John's Church, Parramatta. Governor Macquarie did not like couples living together out of wedlock and encouraged them to marry.






Congratulations to our Students!

TERM 2 SPORT

St Joseph's is very fortunate to have Nicky Western join us for the first half of the term to assist students with developing skills for our annual Athletics carnival. The students are very excited to have Nicky join us and to learn new skills and techniques. Nicky will demonstrate and teach the students the correct techniques for a number of athletic events.

WHAT'S INSTORE FOR YEAR 3 AND 4 IN TERM 2?

Below is a very brief snapshot of the wonderful aspects of learning which Stage Two will be undertaking during Second Term.

In English, students will develop an understanding of persuasive texts and how composers of text use vocabulary and language forms to engage and/or position of the reader. Students will continue to participate in daily spelling and reading groups activities to improve fluency and comprehension.

Students will be hands on this term in Art, experimenting with different techniques such as printmaking and sculptures.

In History, students will investigate the reasons for European settlement and the consequences this decision had on the Indigenous people of the time. They will start to understand concepts of continuity and change and the perspectives of others.

In Health, we will be looking at factors that influence healthy lifestyle decisions and also investigating nutritional choices relating to cultural beliefs, special dietary needs and 'fast food'.

This term in Religion we will be exploring the sacrament of Confirmation, focussing on its importance as a Sacrament of Initiation and its symbols, words and rituals.

Solids, liquids and gases will be our focus in Science this term. Students will recognise that a change of state can be caused by adding or removing heat and they will participate in a variety of experiments to observe the effects of adding or removing heat on a range of solids and/or liquids.

Year 3 will also undertake the NAPLAN testing alongside with Year 5 during Week 4 of this term.

REST AND RECOUP IN MERRIWA

Construction has commenced on a new Driver Reviver facility in Merriwa.

Upper Hunter Shire Council applied for the project funding under the Federal Government's Local Roads and Community Infrastructure Program and received \$150,000 to undertake the works.

The Driver Reviver plans were put on display for community feedback in May last year and will be built at Merriwa Park on the corner of King George V Ave and Quigley Street Merriwa.

Once the new facility has been completed, which is approximately 32m2 and constructed of Colourbond and cladding on a concrete slab, the old facility will be demolished.

The Driver Reviver will have a hand washing basin, security roller shutters and a covered outside aluminum bench seats and table.

The new location will increase safety and parking opportunities, and create a space for tourists to stop and visit the town.

Merriwa Rotary Club and members of the community have been working closely with Council to ensure the project will meet the needs of the Merriwa community.

MERRIWA TO WILLOW TREE ROAD - TRAFFIC OFFENCES

The MR358 Merriwa to Willow Tree Road has been closed to all traffic since January 21 2021 due to the current risk of landslip in some sections, with signs of movement including cracking observed in both lanes which has continued to worsen.

The closure has been undertaken to ensure the safety of road users, based on geotechnical advice.

Despite all reasonable attempts to stop public vehicles entering the site, some have continued to disregard signage, move concrete and water filled barriers and cut chains and locks.

Therefore Council will be installing surveillance devices this week to record all vehicles illegally entering the site. The collected information will be handed to the relevant authorities for processing.

Council apologises for the inconvenience to the road users and the community, however safety of the community is paramount and persons damaging these safety barriers are potentially harming themselves and other road users.

The alternative route for motorists wanting to travel this road will be via the New England Highway and the Scone to Merriwa Road with expected additional travel time being approximately 30 minutes (44 kilometres)

Upper Hunter Shire Council Ordinary Council Meeting 29 March 2021

PROPOSED COMMUNITY NURSERY - MERRIWA

Council were in support in principle of the establishment of a community nursery in Brisbane Street, Merriwa. Further information will be provided to Council before the project is passed including a conceptual site plan, management plan and estimate of costs and funding sources.

The community nursery will be used to support the 'Greenthumbs' partnership project which is affiliated with Merriwa Landcare with assistance provided by Council, Upper Hunter Landcare, Department of Primary Industries and Hunter Local Land Services.

The project has strong community support with 62 people attending the workshops from Cassilis and Merriwa with a further 12 'satellite' growers involved.

REQUEST FOR DONATIONS

Council endorsed to waive the fees for The Rotary Club of Merriwa which has organised a senior's luncheon at the Merriwa School of Arts Hall on 7 April 2021, as part of the NSW Seniors Festival.



A Walk Down Memory Lane

William Lawson and Sarah Leadbeater were married by special licence at St John's Church, Parramatta. Governor Macquarie did not like couples living together out of wedlock and encouraged them to marry.

Lawson acquired land at Prospect, some by grants and by purchases, the property he Veteran Hall, He eventually owned 3000 acres. His stock of cattle and sheep increased and his obvious success enhanced his standing in the community. In 1813, an attempt to cross the Blue Mountains was made by Gregory Blaxland, William Lawson and William Charles Wentworth. Thirteen previous attemptshad been made and failed, but this party finally succeeded.

The way had been opened and William Cox built his famous road from Emu Plains to Bathurst in 18 months. In May 1815, Governor Macquarie and his wife made the journey to Bathurst which he officially named and established as a town. Lieutenant William Lawson was appointed Commandant of Bathurst. He took up another 1000 acre arant and drove 100 head of horned cattle over the Blue Mountains, the first herd to do so. Between 1820 and 1822, Lawson conducted four expeditions to the country north and northwest of Bathurst. On his fourth expedition on November 24, 1822 he discovered the eastern flowing Goulburn river and on the 4th December, reached the headwaters of the Krui river.

THE BETTINGTON CONNECTION

William and Sarah's daughter, Rebecca married James Brindley Bettington on June 7, 1830.

While working for Jim and Cherie in their garden, Jim told me about his family history. Whilst he was lying in, recovering from two heart attacks, it occurred to Jim that there was a real urgency to write the family history, and this should include the Lawson and Brindley families, as they are an integral part of the Bettington story.

He commissioned Brice Stokes to write the history and as each chapter was completed, Jim gave them to me to bring home and read through. I found the history fascinating and felt privileged to read the early material.
