A Walk Down Memory Lane

SANDY HOLLOW TO ULAN RAILWAY



In the mid 19th century, a railway was proposed to link the far western districts of NSW with a coastal port. The preferred route, which presented fewer engineering problems was from the vicinity of Dubbo through Muswellbrook to Newcastle. However, political pressure from the Bathurst District convinced the NSW Parliament to build a line over the Blue Mountains.

Early in the 20th century, with growing congestion of the ports of Sydney and Wollongong, the opening of a direct route from Dubbo to Newcastle was again proposed. The proposed new railway line was very important to the western district farmers beset by the rising cost of transportation of their produce to Sydney. Approval was finally given in 1927 by Act of Parliament to construct the Sandy Hollow to Maryvale Railway.

Construction did not start until 1936 and then only continued slowly until 1951. By that stage, many of the major obstacles had been overcome and a formation suitable for the axle loadings of those days had been substantially completed.





The advent of cheap road transport, which made rail transportation uneconomical except those on lines of high usage brought about the cessation of construction and the project was abandoned. With the Ulan Coal Mine intention of exporting coal, an agreement between White Industries and the NSW Wran Government saw the recommencement of the rail line from Sandy Hollow to Ulan to move the coal to Newcastle.

The rail line from Muswellbrook to Sandy Hollow also had to be upgraded to handle the heavier loading. Two quarries were created, one on Shannon's property at Merriwa where 250000 tonnes of ballast was extracted and another on Murrumbo property at Bylong where 350000 tonnes of ballast was extracted. The contract for the ballast was won by Readymix Australia and crushing plants were set up at both locations.

REFLECTION -EASTER 5 – John 15:1-8

'Make your home in me as I make mine in you'. These words express the profound insight of this Gospel, that God dwells in us as we dwell in God. God is at home in our living and we have our home within the life of God. I struggled to find words for this truth and can only speak of a famous Icon of the Trinity where there are three figures sitting at a table with an empty space in the foreground. The Icon draws the viewer into this space, inviting the viewer to sit at this table, to join the communion and be part of this divine household.

Just as I use this ancient Russian Icon as an image of our reciprocal dwelling in God, so Jesus gives his disciples an image they would be familiar with, the image of the vine. A vine is one entity. While there may be times when it is technically more accurate to speak of the vine-stock and the vine-branches as separate, usually they are regarded as one. The vine has no reality apart from its inter-woven branches. The image Jesus offers speaks of the profound intimacy and reciprocity God desires with us. 'I am the vine, you are the branches'.

Just as a vine needs to be cared for by the vinedresser, being 'at home' with another requires time and tending. Home-making is the task of a lifetime. May we attend to the God who is at home with us and may we find our home withing the loving embrace of God. (From "Sundays Under the Southern Cross" by Mary Coloe PBVM)

Upper Hunter Shire Council MERRIWA TO WILLOW TREE ROAD – EXPRESSION OF INTEREST FOR REHABILITATION CONSTRUCTION

Council engaged GHD Pty Ltd in January to prepare the detailed design and preparation of tender documentation for the rehabilitation construction of Coulsons Creek Road (MR358) CH 36.2 to CH39.6 to achieve the safe travel of B-Doubles vehicles along this section. GHD's work includes the preparation and submission of all reports, drawings, technical and other documentation as required.

The project is now at a point where Expressions of Interest (EOI) are invited from organisations wishing to be pre-registered to tender for the proposed construction contract or be nominated as a preferred geotechnical subcontractor for Coulson Creek Road (MR358) – Rehabilitation Construction 39/2021. Included in this is the option of Early Tenderer Involvement (ETI), which will allow both GHD and Council to gain valuable input on aspects of the project such as specific design elements (pavement, geotechnical, stormwater and hydrology and structures), constructability and cost validation.

The EOI period closes 10.00am May 6 2021, which is available on Tenderlink For any further information regarding this please contact Gavin Newton-Smith 65401100.

MERRIWA TO WILLOW TREE ROAD – TRAFFIC OFFENCES

The MR358 Merriwa to Willow Tree Road has been closed to all traffic since January 21 2021 due to the current risk of landslip in some sections, with signs of movement including cracking observed in both lanes which has continued to worsen.

The closure has been undertaken to ensure the safety of road users, based on geotechnical advice.

Despite all reasonable attempts to stop public vehicles entering the site, some have continued to disregard signage, move concrete and water filled barriers and cut chains and locks.

Therefore Council will be installing surveillance devices this week to record all vehicles illegally entering the site. The collected information will be handed to the relevant authorities for processing.

Council apologises for the inconvenience to the road users and the community, however safety of the community is paramount and persons damaging these safety barriers are potentially

harming themselves and other road users.

The alternative route for motorists wanting to travel this road will be via the New England Highway and the Scone to Merriwa Road with expected additional travel time being approximately 30 minutes (44 kilometres).

REST AND RECOUP IN MERRIWA

Construction has commenced on a new Driver Reviver facility in Merriwa. Upper Hunter Shire Council applied for the project funding under the Federal Government's Local Roads and Community Infrastructure Program and received \$150,000 to undertake the works.

The Driver Reviver plans were put on display for community feedback in May last year and will be built at Merriwa Park on the corner of King George V Ave and Quigley Street Merriwa.

Once the new facility has been completed, which is approximately 32m2 and constructed of Colourbond and cladding on a concrete slab, the old facility will be demolished.

The Driver Reviver will have a hand washing basin, security roller shutters and a covered outside aluminum bench seats and table. The new location will increase safety and parking opportunities, and create a space for tourists to stop and visit the town.

Merriwa Rotary Club and members of the community have been working closely with Council to ensure the project will meet the needs of the Merriwa community.
