

WITH JAMES CONSTABLE

FITZROY HOTEL, WHERE DID THE NAME COME FROM?



Charles Augustus FitzRoy was a British military officer, politician and member of the aristocracy who held governorships in several British colonies during the 19th century. He was born June 10 1796 and died February 16 1858. His spouse was Mary Lennox.

Charles was appointed the tenth governor of the colony of NSW in 1845 and was governor for eight years. As was the custom of the day, many places were named after prominent people, Royalty and explorers and the name FitzRoy was used widely in Australia. It must be remembered that the state of NSW covered most of Australia excluding Western Australia, a smaller part of South Australia and Van Dieman's Land (Tasmania). For a while too, New Zealand was administered from NSW.

Places named after FitzRoy include FitzRoy Crossing in WA, suburbs FitzRoy in Victoria and South Australia, an electoral district in Queensland, FitzRoy Islands in Tasmania, FitzRoy river in Queensland and countless others including the FitzRoy hotel in Merriwa. The early

spelling with the capitol R was in keeping with the name but all appear to have lost the capitol R.

A newspaper report first mentions the hotel with a report; FitzRoy Hotel, Merriwa, July 1, 1848, the undersigned respectfully begs leave to inform his friends and the public generally that he has opened his house at Merriwa under the sign of the "FitzRoy Hotel". Gentlemen and families travelling on the line of road will find the house commodious, with good accommodation,




CLASS OF THE WEEK







REFLECTION - PENTECOST 2 - Mark 14:12-16, 22-26

Last week we learnt about the sign of the Cross as a bodily gesture to affirm that we are people in communion with God. Today's liturgy continues this theme of living in communion with God as it presents a second great symbol – the eating and the drinking of food.

Because our liturgy has developed over 2,000 years and has become quite formalised we can lose sight that its basic element is a gathering of people round a table to share nourishment. Jesus had many meals with his disciples and friends but only a few meals are written about in the Gospels. The meal this Gospel highlights is his final one. For that reason the gathering had a special, poignant significance. It also coincided with the great Jewish celebration called the Passover. During this meal Jesus gave the ritual bread and wine a new meaning; that of his own life. When he was no longer physically present with the disciples they were to continue to gather around a table, to share bread and wine, and by his words, 'This is my body; this is my blood', he promised that in these gatherings he will be present.

And so Christians had continued this practice of the Lord's Supper, in homes, in caves, in catacombs, in halls, in prison cells and cathedrals. The Eucharist gathers God's fragile, frequently failing people to nourish, forgive and bless. Hear the invitation; 'Come, eat of my bread and drink of the wine I have mixed' (Prov. 9:5) (From "Sundays Under the Southern Cross" by Mary Coloe PBVM)

civility and attention. The mail leaves the "FitzRoy" on Mondays and Wednesdays at one o'clock,pm for Merton, Muswell Brook, Singleton and Maitland, returning Mondays and Fridays. Any parties wishing to travel by the mail, and leave their horses till their return, every attention will be paid to them on a moderate scale.

N.B. Stabling for eight horses with good provender(sic), Charles Thompson.

Most early inns, stores and houses were of slab construction and looked alike with a sign out front declaring their business. In 1892, James Ell built the sandstone (or free stone as it was known) building we know today.
