


During this time, we hope you remain safe and look forward to getting back to print on our return.

A Walk Down Memory Lane

WITH JAMES CONSTABLE



RICHARD JONES AND COCKRABIL

Walter Steven Davidson was the first owner of Collaroy station. In 1924, Davidson bought Saxon Merino sheep for the colony in partnership with Richard Jones, who became his agent and who managed the 5,000 acre property Collaroy on the Krui River near Cassilis.

Richard Jones was born January 1, 1786 at Chirbury, Shropshire, England and died on the 6th November 1852 at New Farm, Moreton Bay, NSW, later to become Queensland.

As part of the Statewide lockdown the Premier announced that the Upper Hunter local government areas (LGA) will move into stay-athome restrictions as of August 14, 2021 5.00pm until August 22, 2021 12.01am.



He comes to school each day dressed in the correct uniform and with everything he needs for learning including a champion lunch box.


Congratulations Paul on your efforts and achievements. You should feel very proud of your achievements.

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WHAT DO YOU KNOW ABOUT LEGO?






It was excellent to see students feeling happier to sit with a task and work through out without giving up.














JUNIOR COOKS CORNER

The Famous Lemonade Scones Recipe

Ingredients

- 1/2 cup (125ml) cream see notes
- 1/2 cup (125ml) lemonade see notes
- pinch salt optional
- 1/4 cup (55g) caster sugar optional
- 2 cups (300g) self raising flour
- 3 tbs milk for brushing

Instructions

- 1. Preheat oven to 200 degrees celsius (fan-forced). Lightly flour a 20cm square cake tin and set aside.
- 2. Place the lemonade and cream into a bowl. Add the salt and caster sugar and mix to combine.
- 3. Sift in the self raising flour and use a knife to fold it through until only just combined (the mixture will be very sticky).
- 4. Place the dough onto a lightly floured board.
- 5. With lightly floured fingers, press the mixture down to a thickness of 3cm (do not over-work the dough).
- 6. Using a 6cm scone cutter, cut rounds from the middle working outwards and place into the lightly floured cake tin (make sure that your scones are gently pressing up against one another as it will help them to rise).
- 7. Gently move the remaining dough together and cut out extra scones.
- 8. When you've used all of the dough, brush the tops of the scones with milk and place into the oven for 12-15 minutes.

The scones will be ready when they're golden on top.

Serve warm with your choice of fillings.

Students in Infants and Stage Two took a "tour" to the Hunter Valley and Melbourne Zoos today

as part of their Incursion Afternoon.

At the Melbourne Zoo, students listened to talks about Penguins, Gorillas, Tigers and Koalas with Miss Brazier. They then were given the task to create one of the habitats using the material provided.

At the Hunter Valley Zoo, Miss Rodwell took students on a discovery journey of the Echidna. Students then col cted leaves for their artwork and learned a few facts about the Echidna.













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Miss Love took students on a Scavenger Hunt and did "Animal Trivia" with the groups.

In Stage Three, Mrs Peebles set students the task to do basic research on Canberra, which was to be their destination this year before COVID and gave them the goal of "packing their bags for Canberra". Could a discovery tour be in the offering?

We are spoiled to have such high quality and innovative teachers to provide students with alternate experiences in these uncertain times.

HAVE YOUR SAY - Tell Them From Me (TTFM®.) Survey – Delayed start

Last year you may recall parents, staff and students (Years 4–6) participating in an online – Tell Them From Me (TTFM®.) survey.

Schools in Australia and around the world have used the Tell Them From Me survey to help them improve.

The data we received provided us with valuable feedback in relation to faith, learning, student engagement and wellbeing and will help to better inform our Diocesan system as well as our own school improvement agenda.

After reading the results of the survey, we put the following into place:

What we did:

- 1. Established a homework club to assist with students having difficulties due to lack of parental assistance, internet difficulties etc
- 2. Behavioural Expectations were raised and behaviour matrix commenced (40% reduction in behaviours in 2021). Also, PB4L expectations were commenced. Gotchas are now an integral part of the daily routine for students, especially ones who always follow expectations.
- 3. Have adopted the High Expectation / No Excuse approach. Learning Intentions and Success Criteria with feedback, constant monitoring and high expectations for learning
- 4. School to share more articles and snippets from social justice action in order to educate parents.

REFLECTION - PENTECOST 12 - John 6:51-58

Todays Gospel is the whole purpose of this long discourse, for today's passage focuses on the Christian Eucharist. The very first disciples all had personal experience of Jesus. The were able to be with him, to hear his words and to express their belief in him directly. By the time John's Gospel is written, most of the community would be second or third generation Christians who have not had such personal contact. Where can these Christians experience Jesus' presence and express their faith in him? The Gospel points to the presence of Christ in the celebration of the Christian Eucharist.

At this point you and I are drawn into this Gospel, for like the Johannine community we have not encountered Jesus of Nazareth. Our encounter with Jesus must be through the sacramental symbols of bread, wine, the word and the community gathered to celebrate the Lord's Supper. Again the contrast is made between the Eucharist and the manna, for the life Jesus offers us is forever. The Jewish Christians of John's first community have not lost touch with their traditions, nor have they lost touch with the God of their ancestors who fed them bread from heaven. In and through Jesus, God's nourishing gift of life for the world is available to all people of all ages.

But what is our response? The invitation is given 'Come and eat my bread and drink my wine', but some find this too hard to accept. This long Gospel passage continues with this question next week. (From 'Sundays Under the Southern Cross' by Mary Coloe PBVM)

SHIRLEY SHARPE 1936-2021

A Walk Down Memory Lane WITH JAMES CONSTABLE

He was educated in London and entered a London business as a clerk and early chose a mercantile career. He first arrived in Sydney in 1809 and by 1815, he was agent for Forbes and Co of Bombay. In the same year he set up in Sydney as a general merchant in partnership. In 1818, Jones sailed to China on the 'Magnet' and after a short stay there, where he probably began negotiations with W. S. Davidson for a joint pastoralist venture. He returned to England and in 1823, he married Mary Louisa Peterson (1804-1887). The couple arrived in Sydney in where Jones became a successful merchant and pastoralist.

Richard Jones had settled on the Krui river by 1830 and left his property in the care of Hugh MacDonald. Jones appears to have moved his stock as far as the Krui by 1830 to a station named Cockrabil, managed by Hugh MacDonald, who for his services in the capture of bush rangers on the Liverpool Plains, received a grant of one square mile (640 acres) of land free of Quit Rent, which he selected adjacent to Jone's Cockrabil property. Cockrabil was situated between Pembroke and Collaroy up the Pembroke road. In a newspaper article, the land promised by Governor Darling on the 20th November 1830 to Hugh MacDonald seems to have been acquired by Richard Jones by 22nd April 1833. By the 1840's, Cockrabil seems to have been absorbed into Collaroy station.

Richard Jones also acted as agent for Walter Davidson who had came to the colony in 1805 and had returned to England in 1809, he never returned to Australia.

Collaroy had a small frontage to the Krui river and became the basis of what was later to become known as Collaroy station. Jones also sought to purchase for Davidson, the place called Wille Walle (Willy Wally), adjacent to Davidson's grant of 5,120 acres on the western side of the Krui. Neither Richard Jones or Walter Davidson were resident lawnowners. Both were using land as an investment and outlet for the pasturing of stock. The time was opportune for such speculation. The good quality and suitability of Australian wool was now established in the English market. Richard Jones was described by Henry Hamilton, a relative of Davidson as "a perfect old spider, clutching at anything he can lay his hands on". He was not interested in anything but the financial return. He only visited the district perhaps once a year. The land both

sides of the Krui was acquired by Richard Jones as well as land extending to the west as far as the Talbragar river. In February 1834, Jones purchased 2234 acres on the Krui.

NSW HEALTH SEWAGE SURVEILLANCE PROGRAM EXTENDED TO SCONE

NSW Health has extended their Sewage Surveillance Program to include the Scone Sewage Treatment Plant (STP) for an initial two week period commencing 16 August 2021.

The NSW Sewage Surveillance Program tests untreated sewage for fragments of the COVID-19 (SARS CoV-2) virus at sewage treatment plant locations across NSW. Testing sewage can help track infections in the community and provide early warning of an increase in infections.

NSW Health decide all testing locations within NSW and have confirmed that there is currently no capacity to pick up additional testing sites within the Upper Hunter Shire. However, Council continues to liaise with NSW Health regularly in regards to the evolving COVID-19 situation, and will certainly facilitate testing in our other sewerage systems if this option becomes available.

It's been so good, I've been out in the garden making the most of this beautiful weather, I've read a couple of chapters of a book, been for a walk. I've been able to chill and it's just like a big release, when you haven't got to worry for an hour."

Lauren Sinderberry is another Wellbeing Superspreader who's taking some time to be kinder to herself and she's set herself a goal to try a 'self-compassion' practice.

Why: "I have very high expectations of myself and I'm a little bit hard on myself when I don't execute things the way I think they should be done. I need to cut myself some slack. It's about being a bit kinder to myself when I can't do everything I think I should."

How: "Coach Emma gave me a poster to put up that reminds me to take a breath when I get stressed out; to take a breath, to put things in perspective and to remind myself to talk kindly to myself."

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

Henry's first Action for Wellbeing is to identify three good things that happened in his day during dinner with his fiancé Emma.

Why: "When we met up with all the other Wellbeing Superspreaders Emma Sparrow said it's something she does with her family every night and that it works really well for them."

Outcome: "We've tried it a few times and it's been really good. It's pretty easy to talk about all the crap things that can happen in the day – who annoyed you at work or what went wrong – this is a nice way to look at the positives in a day. Kylie Austin's first goal is all about giving herself an hour each day away from her phone, from her computer; just be device free.
