### Le Tour de Merriwa

Come and ride along Coulson's Creek Road towards Willow Tree ...

Coulson's Creek Road is a quiet rural road with minimal traffic and a relatively good road surface.

All riders will roll out of Merriwa at 8.00am and will need to be back in Merriwa by 12.00pm.

Riders can turnaround at any point, tailoring the distance to suit their ability.

Refreshments and toilet at 21kms, far turnaround and refreshments at 41kms (approx).

Following on from Merriwa's first ever cycling event last March entries have just opened for the second Edition of Le Tour de Merriwa.

The course winds out of town and up Coulsons Creek Road which crosses the Great Dividing Range 41km South of Willow Tree.

Last year we went to the top of the range and back and this year we were hoping to go down the other side onto the Liverpool Plains before turning around however, due to subsidence, the road has been temporarily closed 3km from the top on the Merriwa side.

That means that unfortunately this year's course misses the really big mountain climbs.

The good news is that 72km of the ride (total distance 78km) will now be on a road with no through traffic - a cyclist's paradise.

Registration is \$45.00 and includes:

- Freshly baked date loaf, banana bread (and gluten free options) made by our local Country Women's Association
- a post ride BBQ run by Merriwa Mens Shed
- Electrolytes
- Energy Gels
- Insurance
- Bottled Water

The fee also includes a \$10.00 donation to the Merriwa Volunteer Rescue Squad who will be managing traffic control.

This is a fair dinkum, grass roots country ride through one of the most beautiful dry land agricultural areas in Australia.

The whole town really gets behind this event and will be decorating in the blue white and red.

If you can't make it to France this year then this is the next best thing.

#### **TELL THEM FROM ME**

In 2021 Merriwa Central School students from Year 4 to Year 12 will participate in a Department of Education initiative: the Tell Them From Me student feedback survey. The survey measures factors that are known to affect academic achievement and other student outcomes. The focus of the NSW-wide survey is on student wellbeing, engagement and effective teaching practices.

The survey is a great opportunity for our students to provide us with valuable and quick feedback on what they think about school life, how engaged they are with school and the different ways that teachers interact with them. More than 6,300 schools in Australia and around the world have used Tell Them From Me to survey 5.4 million students. Capturing the voices of our students will help improve how we do things at our school.

I want to assure you that the survey is confidential. The survey is conducted online and will typically take less than 30 minutes to complete. It will be administered during school hours between March 8 and April 30. Participating in the survey is entirely voluntary.

A consent form for parents/carers about the

survey is being sent home with students. If you do not want your child or children to participate, please return the form to school.

#### **SCHOOL ATTENDANCE**

Regular attendance at school is essential for students to achieve quality life outcomes. Schools, in partnership with parents, are responsible for promoting the regular attendance of all students. Parents or carers of children of compulsory school age are responsible for ensuring their child attends school every day.

Recent roll checks have been conducted at school and letters will be mailed out to families of students who have attendance patterns causing concern. If you receive a letter regarding the attendance of your child, please read it carefully along with the attached attendance brochure. If you require further information or support, please don't hesitate to contact the school and speak to our Deputy Principal, Miss Sharon Kenaly.

Students who have had consistent, regular attendance this term, meeting the Department of Education's requirements, will receive an attendance certificate acknowledging their efforts before the end of term.

#### **SCHOOL RESPONSIBILITIES**

School must ensure:

- Early identification of students at risk of developing poor attendance patterns through strategies such as regular roll checks
- The school's Learning and Support Team, in partnership with parents, identify and implement strategies that address the learning and support needs of a student with attendance patterns of concern

That if a range of school based interventions have been unsuccessful in resolving attendance difficulties, the principal can request support by making an application to the Home School Liaison Program and submitting the application to the local program manager for consideration.

#### **PARENT RESPONSIBILITIES**

#### Parents must ensure:

- Their children, who are enrolled at school attend every day the school is open for their instruction
- It is very important that your child arrives at school on time each morning so that they are ready to learn and receive the appropriate learning support
- They provide an explanation for absences by means such as a telephone call, written note, through the school app or email to the school within 7 days from the first day of any period of absence. Where an explanation has not been received within the 7-day timeframe, the school will record the absence as unjustified on the student's record
- They work in partnership with the school to plan and implement strategies to support regular attendance at school, including communicating with the school if they are aware of issues impacting on their child's attendance or engagement with school.

#### Important points to remember:

- Families should try to arrange holidays in school vacations or seek application for extended leave travel at the school office
- A child must be at school every day unless he/she is too sick to attend school, has been injured and can't attend school, has a special religious ceremony to attend, has an infectious illness e.g. Chicken Pox, Measles etc. or seeks leave from the school for various reasons acceptable to the Principal
- Appointments with people like doctors or dentists should be made for before or after school wherever possible
- On occasion, your child may need to be absent from school. Justified reasons for student absences may include:
- being sick or having an infectious disease
- havinganunavoidablemedicalappointment
- being required to attend a recognised religious holiday
- exceptional or urgent family circumstances e.g. attending a funeral.





#### **WONDERFUL 2D SHAPES**


Students enjoyed copying and making their own pictures with a range of 2D shapes.

#### LET'S IMPROVE SPELLING AT CASSILIS

This year Cassilis Public School will be implementing a new Spelling Program to improve the spelling skills of our students. This focus aligns to both our School Plan's Strategic Areas- Student Growth and Attainment and High Quality Practice.



#### REFLECTION - LENT 3 - John 2:13-25

Today we hear of the first public action of Jesus according to John's Gospel. Jesus obeys the Jewish law and goes to celebrate the Passover in Jerusalem. Because Jews came from all around the Roman Empire for this Festival, animals were brought into the Temple precincts so that pilgrims could buy what they needed for the Passover sacrifice. This was also the time when the Jews paid their taxes to support the ongoing sacrifices in the Temple. Two animals were killed every day as a ritual to forgive sin. By contributing through the Temple tax, every Jew participated in this daily ritual to reconcile them with God. However, this tax needed to be paid with special coins that did not have the image of the Roman Emperor, and only at this time of the year were tables set up in the Temple to let people change their coins into special coins without a 'graven image.'

This is the background to Jesus' actions in the Temple. It is not really a cleansing since all the animals and money changes were there as help to the people during this Passover time.

Jesus' actions are a powerful prophetic symbol announcing the end of such Temple sacrifices. This is the meaning of his actions, which the Jews understand since they asked him for his credentials. 'What sign do you have?' or 'What's your authority for doing this?' Jesus' reply points to himself as the living Temple where God dwells. With the coming of Jesus a building made of stones is no longer needed to reconcile with God. (From "Sundays Under the Southern Cross" by Mary Coloe PBVM)







## **Merriwa Pony Club**

Dozens of riders descended upon Merriwa showground from as far away as Walcha, Kootingal and Gloucester on Sunday for what proved to be a spectacular test of courage, determination, focus and fitness.

This was the third time the Merriwa Pony Club have hosted a tetrathlon and if the enthusiasm generated by the athletes in attendance is anything to go by, it won't be their last.

The 'tet' as it is affectionately known, is completed by athletes who must successfully complete four phases - jumping, running, swimming and shooting.

Merriwa Pony Club president Clare Martin said it was a new event for pony club members in New South Wales but was becoming increasingly popular.

"It is a wonderful way for riders to show what they can do on - and off - their horses.

"Not only do their horses need to be fit, but so do the riders.

Mrs Martin said the event really took athletes out of their 'comfort zone'.

"It is as much about getting the mind right as it is about getting you and your horse fit.

"Riders must develop lots of skills to be able to ride well but in this event they also need endurance to be able to run up to three kilometres, great technique to be able to swim up to 200 metres and then they need patience and accuracy to be able to shoot.

"It's a great test of skills on so many levels.

In the senior competition, Nicole Martin (Merriwa) took out top honours with Anastasia Haling (Kootingal) coming in second place. In juniors Darcy Taaffe (Merriwa) lead the pack with Olivia U'ren (Kootingal) second and Amy Redgate (Denman) a close third.

In the sub junior competition Miriam U'ren (Kootingal) was triumphant with Charlotte Marchant (Gloucester) close on her heels followed by Nikko Anderson (Merriwa), Gabrielle Mclean (Denman) and Ben Patterson (Merriwa).

In the Minis age group it was Merriwa riders all the way with Lilly Martin on top of the podium, Olivia Curteis, Eddison Raines and Wren Osborne with Angus Mclean (Denman) placing fifth. Meanwhile in the Peewees age group Fletcher Martin (Merriwa) was the overall winner followed closely by Claire Raines (Merriwa), Charlotte Caruana (Denman), Isabelle and Ella Pryor (Merriwa).

## **A Walk Down Memory Lane**

WITH JAMES CONSTABLE

#### THE MERRIWA OASIS CAFE

A notice appearing in the Merriwa and Cassilis News, dated Friday November 29 1935, "As announced by advertisement elsewhere in this issue, a new business will be opened in Bettington street on Thursday next, December 5, to be known as the Merriwa Oasis. As the name would imply, it has been the aim of the proprietor to provide a bright spot in our midst, and he undoubtedly succeeded along these lines", the article goes on to say "The proprietor, Mr J N Kyriakou realises that the success of a business depends largely on prompt attention, cleanliness and civility and he is determined that his business will not be found wanting in any of these directions and what is more, he is a believer in advertising.

Mr W Hindes, late of Moree is the builder and the workmanship showed throughout the building reflects very great credit to him as a contractor."

By a happy gesture on the part of Mr Kyriakou, the funds of the Merriwa District Hospital will benefit to the extent of half the takings on Friday December 6.

At a later stage, a cellar was dug under the cafe which housed a motor and compressor for the refrigeration units. A kerosene powered generator provided electricity. Originally the cellar would have been quite roomy, but after heavy rainfall, water found its way into the cellar, resulting in the eastern wall collapsing. The photo shows a good deal of rubble which was taken from the collapsed section, leaving an untidy appearance.

Philomena Constable (nee McRae) remembers going into the cafe with her mother at about age 6, and told Mr Kyriakou that it was her birthday today. A big fuss was made by John Kyriakou and he turned around and took down a gift off the shelves, a teapot full of Iollies and wrapped in cellophane and handed it to Philomena. She showed me the teapot during a chat I had with her in 2020, she said "but the Iollies are long gone".

It is an amazing pool that has nine lanes. I was in lane 7 for butterfly and lane 8 for freestyle.


I swam a time of 48.03 for my butterfly and won my heat. I ended up fifth overall.


Then I had a long wait till my freestyle lap and I beat my PB swimming a 41.05.
