MCS students from Years 9, 10 and 12 took part in Mental Health training from the renowned company BATYR. With statistics including - of every 30 students in Australia, 7 will be dealing with a mental health issue, yet only 2 will reach out for support, leaving 5 suffering in silence. It is important that our students engage in positive conversations about mental health and give them the power to reach out for support when needed. BATYR philosophy is Engage young people by talking about mental health and wellbeing. Educate through sharing a young people by giving them the knowledge and skills to lead mentally healthy lives.

BATYR also ran whole school staff training to upskill on Mental Health and learn skills to support our student body, as well as being confident in monitoring our own Mental Health.

The students were outstanding in their openness to engage in the program, and this was reflective in their evaluations. BATYR were so impressed with their engagement, interest and enthusiasm they have requested that our school be part of a national program due to run out in 2023. BATYR will return each year to facilitate tailored programs that continues to empower our students.
