## **Secondary News**

#### **Charge Around Australia STEM Roadshow**

On Thursday, 28 July Charge Around Australia STEM Roadshow visited Years 5-10 to deliver a range of STEM activities. The Charge Around Australia (CAA) crew have collaborated with the University of Newcastle's Centre for Organic Electronics to use the newly developed flexible solar panels to allow them to circumnavigate Australia starting in September. Our students were lucky to have the opportunity to have scientists from the University, Ben and Nick as well as CAA director Stuart to lead them in a range of activities. They were able to see the flexible panels in person, hear from Stuart how he has circumnavigated both England and Iceland's coast lines and about his upcoming trip to drive the entire coastline of Australia in the Tesla. Students were able to get into the car and had an absolute ball seeing how many could fit in at once and how loud they could play the sound system.

Ben led the students through the process of making solar cells and each student was able to make their own then test which part of the light spectrum it absorbed. Nick had the students work on their collaborative skills and challenged them to a car race. The students had to complete activities to build up charge so that their car had enough power to complete the track. Some of the activities included a bean bag toss, friction heating of copper pipes and running around a track. The students then had the opportunity to participate in a live talk with a scientist from inside one of the University science labs, showing the students how they make printed solar cells, what kind of work scientists perform, and how students could work in a STEM field when they leave school.

The students had a fantastic time participating in the roadshow and we thank Charge Around Australia and the University of Newcastle for visiting us and wish them luck for their upcoming trip around the coastline of Australia.
