K-6 Writing







Merino Wether Challenge

Merriwa Central School participated in the NSW School Merino Wether Challenge 2022. Students received 6 merino wethers from Egelabra, Warren on 6 March. Students from Years 9-12 fed the wethers and taught them to lead on halters in preparation of the show. Students learnt about nutrition, husbandry drenching, practices such as condition scoring and judging. The sheep were kept at Merriwa Central school until judging on Tuesday, 23 August. Schools from across the state participated in the NSW School Merino Wether Challenge with 124 teams entered. Year 11 students selected the best team of 3 wethers and the sheep were placed in two teams (3 wethers in each team). Sheep were weighed, aged and a wool sample taken on arrival. Judging commenced on Tuesday and concluded on Wednesday. Sheep were judged for re-stocker value, wool value and carcase value. Merriwa competed with schools in the Tablelands. We placed third for carcase traits within the regional category and one team was called back to compete in the overall regions for carcase traits.




