It is important that all students attend school during this testing period.

Merriwa Central School students have been invited to attend a visiting performance from the Bell Shakespeare Company on Thursday 19 May 2022. This will supplement the study of William Shakespeare in 7-10 English.

Students will be watching the performance "Shakespeare is Dead'

"Offering a smorgasbord of Shakespeare, from romance to tragedies to histories and comedies, students will be introduced to a host of Shakespeare's characters and explore some of his most iconic scenes. Students will learn key plot devices and language techniques, receive a masterclass in iambic pentameter, and even learn about Elizabethan England and the world in which Shakespeare wrote his plays.
